# The NEW Nursing Home Survey Process

## Preparing Your Team for Success!

The goal for the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) in the development of the new survey process is to improve the efficiency and effectiveness of annual nursing home surveys by combining the successful elements of the traditional and QIS survey protocols. The hope of CMS is that improvements will be seen at the population level to reduce adverse events and preventable healthcare acquired conditions and improve care.

This program will offer participants the knowledge needed to prepare and succeed under the new survey guidelines which will go into effect on November 28, 2017, with the new Requirements of Participation for Phase 2. Oklahoma State Department of Health Survey teams will complete their training by October 5 and will then begin surveying under the new system. It is critical that every member of your interdisciplinary team understand the revised survey program in order to transition your organization for a successful survey. Areas to be covered include: automation, sample selection, offsite preparation, information needed upon entrance, survey structure, resident /family interviews, record review, and all other components of the survey process.

### Objectives

- ✚ Understand the new interpretive guidance for standard surveys and investigations that will take effect November 28, 2017
- ✚ Identify the process by which the survey teams will conduct the new standard survey process in nursing facilities
- ✚ Learn how to provide direction to the facility interdisciplinary team on survey readiness under the new protocols
- ✚ Understand the new F Tag renumbering system
- ✚ Receive leadership strategies to implement improvements at the organization level for positive survey outcomes
